Thief of stolen package apprehended on Friday. Citywide police are starting to put out bait packages. Pass along to neighbors to remind friends and family and neighbors to NOT leave anything in your car. Even in your trunk! (Thieves watch as you put packages in your trunk when you're out shopping)

Question: Starbucks at 65<sup>th</sup> and Broadway saw a POP (problem oriented policing) officer. Is that program back?

Answer: Yes! We have full POP teams and GET teams (Gang Enforcement Teams). Focused on problem areas in neighborhood, including illegal dumping.

Question: Homeless camping around the bathroom at Tahoe Park is increasing, may be due to weather. Do you know if the bathrooms are being locked again?

Answer: Hard problem to solve. Unless there is a shelter available we cannot cite them for it, due to the camping ordinance. Come to a consensus about what is going on and what the neighborhood would like regarding the bathrooms and we can send to Lieutenant Stinson.

  - o As Isaac recommended at the Land Use committee the developers reached out to SABA (Sacramento Area Bicycle Advocates) and held a meeting. There is a potential to effect policy change so that counts numbers as front doors instead of leases.
