- IX. Guest Presentations:

- a. Chief of Police – Danial Hahn along with Captain Dan Monk came to the meeting to speak. The Chief talked about the police force is 150 officers short of what we have had at top staffing levels. There are constant issues with keeping Sac PD officers. A major task is to get officers to stop leaving for other cities, we lose about 50 per year. Even with academy graduates we are still losing more than we are gaining. Each Captain crafting the needs for each area. Their job is to improve the quality of life for our city. Town hall meetings are scheduled. This Thursday there is a meeting in Colonial Heights. The Chief is committed to building trust with neighbors and the police department. Changes in relationships with neighborhoods are needed and he is determined to make it happen. Changes needed with Academy standards so there is a more efficient flow of new recruits. Homeless issue was asked by a neighbor. The city and County working together to get a holistic approach to homeless. There is a belief that homeless should be taken care of by law enforcement. How is that going to solve the homeless issues? How do we get a better partnership with the county? Looking at smaller facilities throughout the community instead of large facilities. Invite officers to attend events. Part of their jobs are to have ongoing relationships with people in the community. Internal Affairs is a good place to log a complaint if you see something serious with a police officer. Have some POP (problem oriented police) teams now but wanting to increase. More motors needed. More narcotics officers needed.
