- e. Land Use Committee – 63<sup>rd</sup> Street, asbestos abatement has taken longer than originally thought. The Marjorie Way project is in front of the planning commission this Thursday. Fairgrounds development - 63 homes across from 42 homes at the Grounds already being developed. Ground breaking for the punch through at Folsom from Ramona is being rescheduled to 4/5/18 at 12:00. Any news on Dorris Lumber? No Fox trailers has sold their property to the Element, what is their intention with this property?
- f. Youth Park Community Enrichment – Shannon Brown reporting, she apologizes to the neighborhood association for not including us in the conversation. The city is in a stronger position with its budget. We now have an aquatic supervisor. The city will be taking over the pool from the YMCA. There will be a new pool recreational swim program with some additional family nights and some facility improvements. The first goal will be to have a similar season starting 6/2/18 to early September. Group levels by age and experience. Will offer a swim team. The swim lessons will do morning and evening swim lessons. Lap swim will be offered morning and evening. Water aerobics will be offered too. Will do a kick off week of swim lessons. Summer kick off with the first day kids are off school. 6/15/18. 3:00 – 7:00 on Friday recreation swim. A more finalized schedule will be pulled together soon. Will work with the YMCA for water instructors. More sports youth programs will be offered in the park including Flag football. Youth and adult volleyball may be offered too. We are appreciative of the YMCA's running of the pool. We hope this welcoming partnership will continue with the City. A plan will be in place by May 1<sup>st</sup>. The audience asked if we can get flyers for all the kids at the school. Yes, they will provide. Invite them back in May to talk about the online registration system they can talk about. If Measure U fails to pass then the YMCA will be back running the pools. The jogging path has been completed. Irrigation improvements are happening. Please let them know about issues in the park. The 11<sup>th</sup> avenue and 60<sup>th</sup> Street dog fountain will not shut off. The horseshoe pits are supposed to be maintained by the city. Volunteers have been taking care of it instead. Restrooms are in the pipeline to get locks installed.
