The Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) Post 67, established in 1917, is the oldest chartered VFW in California.

Located at 2784 Stockton Blvd., the Lt. Lansdale post provides support to veterans of all branches of the service, their families, and the local community. Such services include a VA Claims Clinic on the second Wednesday of the month to help veterans with questions and to assist with any benefit questions. On Sundays, from 8:30 a.m. through 12:00 p.m., delicious and reasonably priced breakfast and early lunch is available to the general public. The VFW also has a large hall, as well as a smaller hall, which are affordable and available to be rented out to the public for graduation parties, community dinners, ceremonies, wedding receptions, and other gatherings. Post 67 also has a full bar and commercial kitchen, with free parking onsite of up to 100 vehicles. The Commander of Post 67, Norma Christensen, herself a Tahoe Park resident and community activist, invites the community to come and learn more about this storied and historical post right in our neighborhood. Luigi's Pizza Parlor

Luigi's Pizza Parlor, located at 3800 Stockton Blvd, has new ownership! Complete with a totally renovated dining room, vintage pinball arcade and plenty of room for families. We are excited to be a part of the Tahoe Park community, and with being only minutes away from all of Tahoe Park, this new summer hang out can be your weekly spot to enjoy an ice-cold beer on draft and craft cans, great Italian wine selections and “pizza all day”.

There are a few versions of Luigi's Pizza Parlor's origin story out there. Here's what we like to believe...In 1953, Luigi's Pizza Parlor was opened by a team of bookies from Southern Italy. Seeking a front for their illegal gambling, the owners made pizza, pasta and sauces from scratch in the hopes that their back-room card games and gambling business would be overlooked by the Sacramento Police Department. As it turned out, these bookies were better at slinging pie than running numbers, and Luigi's Pizza Parlor successfully settled into place as the oldest original pizza parlor in Sacramento.

In 1965, the Brida family of Northern Italy bought Luigi's and continued the tradition of great pizza. For an impressive 53 years, the Bridas have passed the parlor from generation to generation, handing down secret family recipes, and making Luigi's Pizza Parlor the much loved restaurant it is today. In 2019 the traditions of Luigi's Pizza Parlor were once again passed on. This time to Sacramento-local families with a deep love for pizza and beer. Neighborhood Renovations

A new Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon crossing is scheduled to be installed at the 60th St crossing of at 14th Avenue to provide safer pedestrian access between Tallac Village Shopping Center and central Tahoe Park. This is but one of several badly needed pedestrian crossings that TPNA has been pursuing for the arterial streets in our community. Currently, the project is being advertised. It will be two months until the bid can be awarded. Construction could begin as early as June.

The bathrooms at Tahoe Park are due to be renovated this coming fall. Plans call for the existing building to be modified to create two unisex single person ADA compliant restrooms with locking doors. Doors will automatically lock from the outside between sundown and sunrise hours to discourage anyone from camping inside of them. Construction is expected to begin at the end of summer, after Labor Day.

Scholarships

On June 6th TPNA will award approximately \$4000 in scholarships to deserving Hiram Johnson High School seniors who have been accepted to 4-year colleges or universities. Applicants have until May 1 to submit their applications, which includes an essay on What Community Service Means to Me. Details of the awards ceremony, as well as the names of the lucky awardees have not yet been determined. This year will mark the 14th consecutive year that TPNA has awarded scholarships to Johnson graduates. Since 2006, TPNA has awarded over \$50,000 to over 70 graduating seniors. Three families have had multiple awardees since we began our program. Thanks to the community for supporting this very worthy enterprise which invests in future leaders. Mae taught elementary school for the West Sacramento School District for 13 years before launching Fong & Fong Printers with her husband Paul; one of northern California's premier commercial printing companies. During Mae's career; she had many affiliations. She was a Charter and Founding Member of the Boards of River City Bank and First Commercial Bank, served on the board of SACTO and was honored by the Sacramento Chamber of Commerce as a "Businesswoman of the Year". She also believed in philanthropy and supported many local organizations in the Sacramento area.

Vice Mayor Guerra presented a proclamation from the City Council to Jenny Stowers, wife of former TPNA board member and Land Use Committee founding member Monty Stowers for his contributions to the neighborhood, the city, and his country. In attendance were numerous friends and relatives of Monty, including children Molly and Sam. In presenting the proclamation to Jenny, VM Guerra cited the numerous phone conversations he had with Monty regarding issues important to the neighborhood, and how much he appreciated those calls.

Senate Bill 58

Senate Bill 58, which would extend sales of alcohol in bars, nightclubs, and restaurants until 4:00 a.m. in ten California cities, including Sacramento, was passed by the Senate Governmental Organization committee on March 12. From there, it was to be "re-referred" to the Appropriations Committee. As of this writing, a date for the hearing has not been determined. The TPNA has taken a position against SB 58 and has sent a letter to the Appropriations Committee to that effect. If it passes in Appropriations, the bill would then be sent for another hearing in the Assembly. The Elmhurst Neighborhood Association has joined TPNA in opposition to this bill. When an earlier iteration of this bill reached Governor Brown's desk on September 28, 2018, it was vetoed. A press release at the time quoted one of the Governor's reasons for the veto: "I believe we have enough mischief from midnight to 2 a.m. without adding two more hours of mayhem." At the time, the CHP was against the bill, as was MADD. MADD continues to oppose this legislation. The CHP, as a matter of policy, does not comment on pending legislation, their previous comments about the increases in DUI arrests coming on the occasion of the Governor's veto. According to Bruce Lee Livingston, Executive Director/CEO at Alcohol Justice, "dozens of peer-reviewed studies show that two more hours of alcohol sales will nearly double alcohol related violence, crime, police calls, and emergency department visits." A press release last December quotes Mayor Steinberg, who, along with the City Council, supports the bill, as saying the legislation, "gives us the flexibility to tailor our nightlife scene to attract tourists and conventions while protecting the character of our quieter residential neighborhoods."

Land Use Committee

On February 22 the grand opening of the Ramona Avenue Extension took place. The project improves connectivity north and south of Highway 50 by extending Ramona Avenue from Brighton Avenue to Folsom Blvd. The road extension and addition of a new intersection helps close a gap in bicycle and pedestrian access to Sac State. In addition, there are new curbs, sidewalks and median, as well as at-grade rail crossing and streetscape and Public Art Installation. Vice Mayor Guerra and Councilman Harris hosted the ceremony, which was attended by Sac State President Nelson, Power Inn Alliance representatives, other city officials, and the community. TPNA board members Isaac Gonzalez and Terrie Barron attended as well.

On February 28 the Planning Commission heard a presentation from representatives of the The Retreat, a 224-unit multifamily housing complex which will be marketed primarily to college students. Prior to the Commission hearings, representatives from Landmark Properties had met with the TPNA Land Use Committee. The interaction with Landmark and their legal and design teams was productive, and most of the recommendations made by the LUC and TPNA were incorporated into their final plans. TPNA had submitted comments to the Commission prior to the hearing and board members Isaac Gonzalez and Bill Motmans testified at the hearing as to Landmark's willingness to meet with and address concerns raised by the community. It was also noted that the Planning Department's support in encouraging developers of prospective projects to meet with and listen to community concerns prior to making final submission of plans was appreciated, along with Landmark's receptivity to feedback. With Spring upon us, more projects will be coming Tahoe Park's way. We encourage the community's participation.
