- IV. President’s Report - Thank you to Bacon and Butter (Billy Zoelin) for giving us \$1000 for our Scholarship fund. - V. Treasurer’s Report - \$8,949.66 total. \$3,555.10 for Scholarships. \$5,394.56 in the GF. New Pay Pal account is now open. Jack will connect with madelyn to get the new PayPal link posted to the website.
- VI. Committee Reports-
 - a. Scholarship – Today Bill picked up 17 scholarship applications. This is our 12th year. We expect to exceed \$60,000 given in total after this year. The awards ceremony will be June 7th around 10:00 am at Hiram Johnson auditorium. An uplifting and fun event for all.

 - f. Land Use Committee – Remember the Walk Audit on Broadway two years ago? Our CM Guerra paid for some of it. We payed for some of it, We are not on the bicycle Master Plan which is a problem. The City Planner is willing to work with us. Give a list of challenges to the city. We are not getting anything fixed on Broadway anytime soon. Please contact your council member with whatever issues you have. Homes started on Fairgrounds Drive. The construction company is putting in utilities and models. They should have models by Fall. The 63RD street (Fairhaven project) has not broken ground yet. Marjorie Way development is moving forward.

- VIII. New Business – This Saturday, May 6th from 9:00 – 11:30 is the first Lego League (15 students) at the Elementary School. CM Guerra is a sponsor as well as the Optimist club.
- IX. Guest Presentations: Officer Gabe James with the Traffic Enforcement Unit. Two main issues right now: educating bicycle riders obeying the rules of the road (which have the same rules as those driving in cars) and drivers using cell phones when driving which is causing collisions. The Complaint line number 916-808-3777 for enforcement in the area. You need to leave a message and they will return a phone call. A question was asked about whether a light will be going in at 11th and 65th? The answer is unknown. Motor team is currently at 10 officers but did away with the DUI team (they had 10 total). Fatal collisions are up. Fatal pedestrian collisions are up as well. He spoke about Vision zero (fatal collisions to zero). Hoping to get more green bike lanes throughout Sacramento.
- a. Sac City Brews will be going in at Tallac Village; Becky Campbell (food) and Todd (beer) living on Cabrillo Way. Currently doing craft beer of the month club in Folsom. Looking to do a local spot. A family friendly place. Children and dogs welcome. Will be closing by 10:00 pm . Permits are pending. CM Guerra is helping with the process. They hope to open in the fall in the old Winters church location. Hours will be mid afternoons to 10:00 pm. Strictly tap house will include wine too....like the Shack.
